We continue to use our website to update you with the latest news and information. Check out the NEW "District Profile" under the District tab. Our students use the website daily to access Progressbook, which is the main hub for remote, as well as in-person digital learning and communication. They also access their Microsoft Office 365 accounts, which is our adopted cloud-based suite of applications for academic work and productivity. We are still learning how to maximize teaching and learning with these tools, but have been pleased with the progress and support so far, especially with our remote Monday and full-remote learners.

We still have a couple months of winter ahead. Therefore, inclement weather could delay and/or cancel more school. Once we miss 5 days of school due to inclement weather, we will have "remote learning" days. Therefore, the 6th day of inclement weather will be considered a school day, just like our remote Mondays. The Elementary School has used all 5 days, while the MS/HS has used 4 days as of Jan. 26.

The teachers and K-4 students are very appreciative of the PTO's recent purchase of a popcorn machine. It is used as part of an incentive reward for students throughout the year. One of our main goals is to provide fall and spring field trips for K-4 students each year.



We are currently on hold for scheduling our Kindergarten Orientation due to Covid-19 restrictions and social distancing.


Kindergarten screening will be held May 10 and 11. Kim Ekis will send out information for scheduling at a later date.

It is hard to believe the school year is half over already. It seems like yesterday we were planning how school would re-open during this pandemic. Everyone has worked so hard in making this year the best it can be while dealing with all the adjustments due to Covid-19. I cannot thank everyone enough who has helped in getting us to where we are right now. We will continue to work hard as we progress through the second semester.

During the next few months, Mr. Baumgartner will be meeting with students for next year's classes/schedules. He will give current eighth graders and freshmen a hard copy of the curriculum guide to help in planning what classes they would like to request for next school year. Sophomores and juniors will be able to access the curriculum guide from the school website. Mr. Baumgartner does a fantastic job of



explaining all the requirements for each class. If your son/daughter is a sophomore or junior and is interested in Apollo, it is important they speak with Mr. Baumgartner and register online as well. Several programs at Apollo fill up quickly. If you have any questions regarding scheduling for next year, please do not hesitate to contact Mr. Baumgartner or myself.

As I write this, state testing and the ACT for juniors will continue as planned. Some of the days we will be running on an adjusted schedule. The testing dates will be as follows:

- ACT for juniors will be February 23rd with a make-up date of March 23rd
- 3rd 4th grade ELA will be April 13th and 14th
- 5th 8th grade ELA and High School English II will be April 15th and 16th
- 3rd 4th grade Math will be April 20th and 21st
- 5th 8th grade Math and High School Algebra I will be April 22nd and 23rd
- 5th & 8th grade Science and High School Biology, American History, and Government will be April 28th and 29th

We recognize that our students work very hard and do not want these tests to cause anxiety. We would like you to discuss the importance of the tests with your child, as they are important to our district. They allow us to analyze the effectiveness of our academic programs and make needed changes to ensure our students are getting the best education possible. For the high school classes, this is a requirement for graduation. You can help alleviate any stress your child may feel by making sure he or she gets adequate sleep the night before and proper nutrition the morning of his or her test.

I know the seniors are counting down the days until graduation and while it seems like a long way off, it will be here before we know it. Graduation will be held Sunday, May 30th at 2pm in the competition gym. Just a reminder, school, athletic, and Apollo fees will need to be taken care of by May 1st.
