WELCOME BACK FROM PRINCIPAL WAGNER



The Spencerville Elementary staff is excited to welcome your children back to school! We will do everything we can to keep your child safe and healthy. Our goal is to create a warm and positive atmosphere for which your child can learn and grow. We ask for your patience and cooperation as we navigate these unprecedented waters together.

Please see the district plan for details regarding school policies and guidelines. Recess:

Masks are not required for any students while playing at recess, yet they are to maintain social-distancing. This will be a difficult task to enforce, so I ask you to talk about this with your child. Students will need to keep their hands to themselves and will spread out in the recess area. Equipment will be cleaned frequently and hand sanitizer will be available. Dismissal:

K-4 students who do not ride the bus will be picked up in the west parking lot off Kolter Rd as usual. However, we are expecting an increase in the number of students who will be picked up. For this reason, I am asking that parents/guardians pull into a parking spot and walk up to the grade level line to pick up your child. Please DO NOT park along the sidewalk for pick up as this will create a "bottleneck" into the drive that leads into the parking lot. Students will maintain social distancing in their grade level line while they wait for a parent or guardian to walk up to get them.

Kindergarten:

Kindergarten students will be screened August 19th and 20th. This screener will allow us to determine their teacher's assignment. Our goal is to ensure that students of all readiness levels are evenly distributed so they can grow and learn from one another. Please call Mrs. Ekis at (419) 647-4113 to set up an appointment. Once testing is completed, you will receive a letter indicating who your child's teacher is. An Open house for kindergarten students only will be August 27 from 1-4. Times for attending open house are as follow by students' last names: 1:00-2:00 A-G, 2:00-3:00 H-P, and

3:00-4:00 R-Z.

Kindergarten students will receive the KRA assessments Tuesday Sept. 1st and Wednesday Sept. 2nd. This assessment is required by the Ohio Department of Education. Parents will receive a report of the assessment results in early winter. Please schedule this assessment appointment with Mrs. Ekis. Kindergarten girls only will attend school Thursday Sept. 3rd and boys only will attend school Friday Sept. 4th. All kindergarten students will attend school on Tuesday Sept. 8.


Breakfast/Lunch:

Talking with many of the parents through this crisis, I know it has been tough on the homes. From uncertainty of strong internet (if any at all), to having enough devices with multiple kids, to competing for overlapping Zoom times, to balancing your personal work schedule and helping with assignments – I thank you! C.S. Lewis said, "Hardships often prepare ordinary people for an extraordinary destination". How true – we have all grown together in this journey. I believe we have all grown to appreciate each other's commitment to children. I pray that we continue to grow together, find some peace, and that this isn't the "new normal".

We all learned a lot about ourselves and have looked for ways to improve when/if we are challenged with possibly more unexpected moments. As you know, there continues to be concerns related to how schools plan to reopen in September. Be assured, we have been working hard to meet the guidelines driven by the state, the local health department, and the Ohio Department of Education to ensure safety for our students and staff. Here are some bullet points from our re-opening guidelines:

- Face Coverings currently required for students in grades 3-12
- Lockers used only for coat and lunch storage locks will not be provided
- Backpacks encouraged for grades 6-8 due to locker use listed above
- Arrival to school directly to locker (if needed) and report to homeroom
- Breakfast if participating in breakfast, pick-up breakfast and take to homeroom
- Lunch grades 5-12 will eat in the cafetorium with assigned seats, microwaves will not be provided
- 5th grade recess Masks are not required, physical distancing will be monitored
- Water Bottles encouraged as fountains will only be used as a refill station

• Schedule Pick-Up – Schedules will be mailed home and also viewed on-line through Progressbook – please set up Progressbook if you have not already. If you need help, contact the school and ask for our Tech Coordinator, Amy Shoppell x3114.

Fees – an on-line system will be set-up

We know a strong partnership with you will make a great difference in your child's education. As partners, we share the responsibility for our children's success and want you to know that we will do our very best to

- 1. Attends school daily and arrives on time, ready for the day's learning experience
- 2. Becomes familiar with the school's policies, rules, and procedures.
- 3. Get's involved with school outside the classroom setting
- 4. Has a place to study

The number one factor in your son or daughter's education is YOU! Teachers can prepare all they want for a great lesson but if they have no support for enrichment outside the classroom, the chance for success lowers. I ask that you:

- 1. Make time for daily chats about school
- 2. Don't accept "Nothing" when you ask your child "What did you learn today?"
- 3. Check that homework is complete

HEALTH SCREENINGS FOR 2020-2021:

The following health screenings will be completed throughout the school year, thus meeting the Ohio Department of Health requirements:

Vision- K, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, 11 Hearing- K, 1, 3, 5, 9, 11 Height/Weight, B/P- K Vision, hearing, B/P- New students to the school district in any grade *If you do not want your child to participate in a screening, please notify me.*

COVID-19 (NOVEL CORONAVIRUS):

To help slow the spread of COVID-19 as school physically reopens in September, please highly consider the following for your child: 1) DO NOT send your child to school if feeling sick, especially if has a fever (>100 degrees Fahrenheit), a cough, or shortness of breath. Please contact your family physician for guidance or call the Lima COVID-19 Community Call Center at 419.226.9000. 2) If you are called to pick up a sick child, please try to do as soon as possible or have backup arrangements in place. 3) Please reinforce handwashing with soap/water for at least 20 seconds. Encourage your child to cough and sneeze with a tissue or use sleeve. Wash hands or use hand sanitizer afterwards. Your child's teachers will also be reinforcing proper hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette throughout the school year. Please call me for any questions or concerns. Thank you for your cooperation as we start the school year still under a pandemic- we will get through this together!

SPECIAL EDUCATION STUDENTS:

Amended House Bill 95 requires all students who are initially identified with a disability to have a comprehensive eye examination from an eye doctor within 90 days unless the student has had a previous eye examination in the past 9 months. Cost should not be an issue for students without insurance as assistance is available. Please contact the school psychologist, Heidi Hollar, or me for further information.

REMINDER ON SCHOOL'S MEDICATION POLICY:

Any prescription medication that is to be taken during school hours must be dropped off by the parent, guardian, or other authorized adult and will be logged in by the nurse or secretary. Students are prohibited from carrying prescription medication into the school or carry during school hours. In addition, over-the-counter (OTC) medications needs to be dropped off first thing in the morning in the clinic or office. Students are not permitted to have in their possession an OTC medication during school hours.

KINDERGARTENERS:

Please have your child's immunizations completed by the first day of school. If your child received shots over the summer, please turn in an updated copy of the shot record to the elementary secretary. Kindergartners who are not up-to-date on immunizations will be excluded from school by October 15, 2020 as required by Section 3313.671 of the Ohio Revised Code.

A copy of the original birth certificate, issued from the health department in the county where the child was born, is also required for entry to Kindergarten by the first day of school according to Section 3313.672 of the Ohio Revised Code. Hospital birth certificates are not acceptable. Please drop off a copy of your child's birth certificate to the elementary secretary, if you have not already done so.

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YOUTH AND GOVERNMENT

The Spencerville Youth and Government had an unusual year this year because of the COVID-19 pandemic. The Ohio conference held in April was canceled because of the government restrictions so the students did not get to experience the thrill of getting to argue their bills in the Statehouse over an extended weekend. However, Charlie Myers, the head of the Ohio Alliance of YMCAs Youth and Government program, did not want the students to put all that work into researching and writing bills for no reason. The Youth and Government conference (both March and April) were held virtually on Zoom. Students had the opportunity to present and debate their bills via Zoom video conferencing with students all over the state. Students spent three days during different time sessions presenting their bills in committee (usually 10-15 students) and then on the floor (bigger groups usually about double the size). If the bill authors could not attend the virtual meetings, their bills were still presented and argued by other members.

As first year participants, it was very intimidating for our Spencerville students to present and participate in the Zoom sessions. Also, not all the students had the technology to participate in the Zoom conferencing. We had no time to prepare since we could not meet and they had never done anything like this before. The high school is proud of those few students who did step out of their comfort zones and did present their bills virtually. They represented the school well and now have a better understanding of the process for next year. We hope that next year we will be able to go to Columbus as originally planned and present with those students who will participate next year.

That said, of the nine bills that we submitted to the April Youth and Government Conference, we had five bills pass in committee and make it to the YAG House or Senate floor. Of those presented on the floor, we had three pass and move to the YAG governor's desk. Two of those three were signed and one was vetoed. This legislative simulation allows students to experience what it is like to work through the government process of how a bill becomes a law.

We are so proud of all of our students. They tackled many issues in their bills including mental health, graduated fines and fees, environmental protection issues, and education issues such as grading scales, curriculum development, and the valuable practice of teaching life skills. We hope to continue to see this group grow and represent the Spencerville community in future conferences.
